

When I was little, my family would make frequent trips to my grandparents in Lawrenceville, Illinois. Countless evenings were spent catching lightening bugs and putting them in a jar with a little bit of grass, (because, apparently, my sister and I thought the bugs were vegetarians.) After dad punctured air holes in the top of jars with hammer and nail, we had our lightening bugs in a jar – until the next evening when we would let them go and we would repeat the process.





In a similar way, we Christ-followers can take our cue from the lightning bug. God has called us to be shining lights in a dark world. In Mt. 5:14-16, we hear Jesus tell us, "You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. *In the same way, let your light so shine before others that they would see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.*"

When we live with Jesus at the center of our lives, allowing his love, grace, mercy, forgiveness, and compassion to mark the pulsing of our lives, then his light becomes that which shines through us. We become like lightning bugs in a dark world. The darker it gets, the brighter we shine. So even though the world seems to be getting darker in many respects, we have the supernatural ability to shine like stars, (Phil. 2:15), because of the Holy Spirit living in us.

This month, we continue our sermon series called, "City On A Hill." I hope all of you will be here the entire month as we explore God's beautiful design for us to shine. You *are* the light of the world! When you live like Jesus, his light shines through you! In a world where wrong is being lifted up as right; where division, hate, indifference, apathy and judgmentalism seems to reign supreme, you are the light of Christ. Let his love and grace be seen in how you respond to everyone. When you do – you shine like the stars!




