It was Winston Churchill – the larger-than-life personality who pulled Britain through the devastation of World War II – who said, "To improve is to change; to be perfect is to change often."

Those words sound more at home in the mouth of a Greek philosopher than on the tongue of the unapologetic, chain-smoking Prime Minister. In some ways, Churchill's is a romantic view of a force that regularly disrupts our lives and causes us headaches. Change is the Great Enemy of people who find comfort in what is predictable and routine, and I include myself in



that number! For many of us, the very presence of change hints at the things we very much want to hide in ourselves: namely, imperfection and incompleteness. Couched within that stinging reality is another nasty barb: the threat of the unknown. Change always brings with it unknowns.

This is why the story of Jesus is so compelling to me. It's the story of an unchanging, perfect God who breaks into a world afflicted by change. The New Testament isn't the first time God became involved our business, of course; but it is the first time the God of Israel literally took on our flesh and became one of us. In so doing, Jesus brought something eternal and unchanging into our temporal world: access.

It's quite profound. By faith in Jesus' Name, we have *access* to His righteousness (2 Cor. 5:21). By His blood, we have *access* to His Father (Hebrews 10:19-21). By the Holy Spirit, we have *access* to His family (Romans 8). In a world governed mercilessly by change, having access to One who is eternally unchanging brings a great deal of peace. It doesn't save us from experiencing change, but it anchors our soul in the midst of it.

My family and I are counting on those promises as we prepare to depart Saint Matthew for a new future in military chaplaincy. This opportunity – while exciting – means that a great deal of change looms on the horizon for Rebecca, James, and myself: a new home, a new city, a new ministry, and a new mission field – just to name a few.

Those are a lot of changes! But we are trusting that God is using those changes to glorify Himself through us. We believe that Jesus is calling us into a setting where *access* to the Kingdom of God is limited, where Jesus is not known. We are being sent as ambassadors to represent the gospel and raise God's profile on military bases all over the world. It won't be easy, but it will be worthwhile because we will be changed in the process.

Which means we're embracing change. As hard as that is. We can do it because we have access to the eternal, immovable Rock that is our God. We are tethered to One who is trustworthy and faithful in all things. We know the story; now it's our job to tell the story.

We are not expected to go through this life alone and when we are trying to rebound or recover we simply cannot. Our group is for all seniors and not just for folks from this church. We welcome all like minded folks to join in on the many opportunities here.

When I started this journey in 2002, I would have never have believed I would still be here in 2023. Only through God's grace and prayer I have made it. On 1/31/2023 I was able to ring the bell, something I never thought I would get to do. I had a stem cell transplant in 2005 that gave me 20 months of remission. In 2007 I began chemo again. God has always been in this journey with me. I was on the first chemo for 3 months, the second for 12 months, another for 54 months, yet another for 104 months and now this final one for 13 months. That is 15 years of chemo. I am now in a "no detection" stage and my bone marrow biopsy was squeaky clean. God is so good. I will have bone marrow biopsies to make sure my multiple myeloma is still "no detection". They say it will come back, but I am standing on the promise that God is the great physician and he has healed me. Please keep me in your prayers and thank you for being in this


journey with me and lifting me up in your prayers. God is good all the time. - Ruthie Anglin.
