If I asked you what subculture of people stands out to you, would you have one that comes to mind? All of us have more than likely seen evidence of sub-cultures within our American culture. Does anyone remember the "Hippie" subculture? (Maybe some of you *were* a part of that subculture?)  $\bigcirc$  The list can go on: Rock and Roll subculture; Biker subculture; Fitness subculture, just to name a few.



What is interesting to me about these subcultures is that daily life is/was very much influenced by the nuances of that subculture.

Hippies could be identified quickly (rightly or wrongly), by their bell bottoms, hair style and sunglasses. (And their common messages.) A biker subculture could be quickly identified by their motorcycles, the vests they wore, not to mention where they hung out. Fitness folk will be seen eating clean, dressing for a workout and talking about the latest in fitness trends. Every subculture has indentifying marks that make them stand out.

So as a follower of Jesus, would people know you fall into that subculture? (The "Christ-Follower" subculture)? If there is such a thing as a Christian subculture, (or a Jesus culture), what do you think would be the identifying marks of such a person? Would this culture affect the words that came out of our mouths? Would it affect how we dress in public? Would it inform the conversations we have with others? Would it affect where we hung out? With whom we hung out? How we interacted with each other? How we interacted with people we don't know? I think the answer is, "of course!"

As Easter people, we are the ones who should have the most hope, the most grace, the most love, joy, patience, kindness and generosity the world has ever seen. Easter changed EVERYTHING! Because Jesus was raised from the tomb on the first day of the week, we now have hope! We now have joy! We can "try again" when we fail in following Jesus. And ultimately, we now have a promise of eternal life through Christ with the exclamation point of an empty tomb! We have a LOT to be thankful for as "Easter People," because this is our subculture! This is why around the throne there will be people from every tribe and tongue!

My prayer for each of you is that you are able to find those identifiable marks in your life as a Jesus-Follower. I pray that all of us might have grace to live each day as an Easter person: One who has infinite hope because Jesus conquered the grave!
