The Pastors Pen

In 1738 John Wesley had an intense religious experience at a meeting on Aldersgate Street in London. Following that experience, he began preaching throughout the country, forming "classes" and "bands" of new converts to Christ. These classes and bands were Christians who would come together to encourage each other, pray for each other and they watched over each other in love.

Members met regularly for learning and personal accountability. The following questions were used by Wesley for self-examination--and are sure to be a bit convicting and motivating even for us today.

- 1. Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I really am? In other words, am I a hypocrite?
- 2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?
- 3. Do I confidentially pass on to another what was told to me in confidence?
- 4. Can I be trusted?
- 5. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?
- 6. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?
- 7. Did the Bible live in me today?
- 8. Do I give it time to speak to me everyday?
- 9. Am I enjoying prayer?
- 10. When did I last speak to someone else about my faith?
- 11. Do I pray about the money I spend?
- 12. Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?
- 13. Do I disobey God in anything?
- 14. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
- 15. Am I defeated in any part of my life?
- 16. Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy, or distrustful?
- 17. How do I spend my spare time?
- 18. Am I proud?
- 19. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican?
- 20. Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold a resentment toward or disregard? If so, what am I doing about it?
- 21. Do I grumble or complain constantly?
- 22. Is Christ real to me?

Twenty-Two questions! As we approach Easter, I was only going to ask one question: "How is it with your soul?" But in one sense, maybe we can only answer the question about our soul in light of how we answer the 22 questions! Clearly, intentionality of discipleship is crucial in our walk with the Lord.

I enjoy praying for you as the congregation. I enjoy praying for individuals as I come to know situations.
