Thanks to everyone who participated this year to present the Gospel. We appreciate how much of your time and talent you give to this community and our church. We cannot do it without you!



Quantitative evidence does not define the heartbeat of a church. You cannot qualify the spirit a church has by the total number in attendance on a Sunday morning. You cannot measure the momentum a church has by how many people came to a Wednesday night class. You cannot understand the impact our giving has on the church and the ministries and missions we support by looking at total amounts raised. Crunching numbers will never reveal the transformation of a soul for God's kingdom. Only time, prayer, love, the acceptance of Jesus as Lord and Savior and the work of the Holy Spirit can accomplish that most precious thing.

However, we do have to use numbers in order to try and measure our successes here on Earth. With that being said, St. Matthew has much to celebrate as we look back at 2024. Here are just *some* of our praises from the past year:

We took in 38 new members.

We baptized 27 believers.

Our small group attendance was raised in every category.

We raised almost \$2,000 for the Mosaic Pregnancy Center through their baby bottle campaign.

Taste Of Elegance sold out in less than 2 weeks and made \$8,400.

The Joy Of Easter brought over 2,000 people to St. Matthew in person and more than 750 watched online.

Our children's ministry kiddos raised over \$350 for the Rice Bowls Mission Project to feed 44 kids from Christian orphanages for an entire month.

The College Ministry had a successful "pop-up" carnival fundraiser that grossed over \$3,000.

We had to create a new space for our youth program because they were bursting at the seams in their former space.

Approximately 260 kids and volunteers participated in SCUBA VBS and explored the book of John while also raising almost \$4,500 for Operation Christmas Child shoebox supplies.

Youth (Chicago), College (Spring Hill Christian camp in Indiana), CR (Paraguay) and medical (Guatemala) mission trips were accomplished with love and success.

Our Summer Sack Lunch Program packed close to 4,000 lunches for needy children in our community. Beulah Camps were spirit filled and moving.

The New Life Club traveled 1,000's of miles this year with trips to St. Louis Cardinals Spring Training in Florida, Amish Country, multiple trips to Branson, Wisconsin's Fireside Dinner Theatre, an I-75 Michigan road trip, Kansas City, The Ark Encounter in Kentucky and multiple local day trips for shows (Fox Theatre, Omnimax), lunches and more!

On Mission Outreach Sunday we packed 300 backpacks, filled 750 food bags which will feed 4,500 people, and wrote 74 letters for the military.

BSF has expanded to 2 nights and now includes groups for men.

Youth Trivia Night raised over \$3,500 for our new youth rooms.

We had another successful block party with 500 in attendance.

Keyboard Praise brought 625 people to St. Matthew.

Trunk or Treat brought more than 2,000 people to St. Matthew.

We raised over \$6,000 for Baskets of Love.

We packed 865 shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. One New Life Club member single handedly crocheted 300 hats to be packed.

The Glory of Christmas brought over 1,500 people to St. Matthew.

None of this is accomplished without the love, support and dedication of the pastors, staff and; most of all, congregation. Thank you all for your servants hearts and we pray for similar success in the coming year!
